No 4-H or FFA seller can substitute an animal after the sale, nor can they purchase an animal from an auction buyer which the buyer has designated for resale or slaughter. The buyer must have originally designated at sale time that the animal was to be "picked up live" and the resale must take place after the Fair and the animal has left the Fairgrounds.

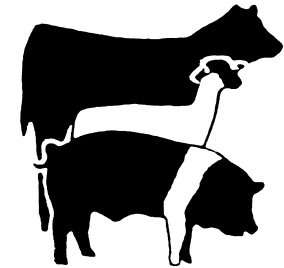

After many months of planning and hard work, the 2010 Glenn County Junior Livestock Auction is close at hand.

The animals that will be presented for sale to the community have had many hours of intense work and a considerable amount of money invested in them by Glenn County 4-H and FFA members. Beginning with the beef projects, which were purchased last fall, up to the more recently purchased smaller animals such as poultry and rabbits, these animals have had lavish attention and the best care possible. Many of our youth support breeding projects within their market project and also show at other Junior shows such as Junior Grand National and specialty breed shows. Exhibitors have attended many training meetings, learning activities and have signed a code of conduct in order to participate in the Junior Livestock Auction.

There are many ways to show support for the Glenn County youth involved in market animal projects through 4-H and FFA. One of the best ways you can show your support is to be a bidder and a buyer at the Jr. Livestock Auction. Following are examples of how you can buy at the Auction:

**OUTRIGHT BUYERS:** You bid a price (usually per lb.) on the animal of your choice against other bidders. The bid amount accepted is the amount the bidder pays to Tri-Counties Bank. The buyer must pay all processing, cutting and wrapping charges directly to your processor.

**RESALE BUYERS:** You bid a price on the animal of your choice against other bidders.

The bid amount accepted by the auctioneer is the sale price. The buyer consigns the animal back to the Glenn County Fair for resale and only pays the difference between the bid amount and the current market price posted at the ring on the day of the sale. There are no process, cut and wrap charges. The buyer does not keep the animal.

**MULTIPLE BUYERS PER ANIMAL:**

Two or more individuals decide to buy an animal together. One person acts as the “responsible party” and bids on the animal of their choice against other bidders. The bid amount accepted by the auctioneer (plus process, cut and wrap charges) is then split between all the multiple buyers as decided amongst themselves. The “responsible party” is the buyer for contract purposes and payment collection.

**PRICE SUPPORTS:** If you would like to contribute a flat amount to support the entire auction or an individual exhibitor, you may do so by issuing a check payable to “Glenn County Fair” before or during the auction. After the results of the sale are tabulated, exhibitors receiving considerably lower prices will receive a support check to help with their expenses.

**PARTICIPATE IN A BUYER GROUP:** If you would like to contribute a flat amount to be pooled with other participants in a buyers’ group, please contact one of the individuals listed on the back of this brochure. The groups purchase “no bid” animals and proceeds left may be used for price supports.

## **Disposition of the Animals**

There are many different choices available for disposition of animals.

***Process*** - All animals will be slaughtered at USDA inspected facilities or may be picked up live and slaughtered at your ranch. The animal is butchered and processed according to the buyer’s instructions with the processor of their choice. You may also make arrangements to donate your animal to your favorite charitable organization. The buyer will be responsible for all processing charges.

***Resale*** - The animal is consigned back to the Fair for resale. The buyer pays only the difference between the bid price and the resale price. The buyer receives no meat in this type of disposition.

***Live*** - The buyer may choose to pick up an animal live after 7:00 p.m. on Sunday of the Fair. They must arrange for pickup and get a signed release from the livestock superintendent before taking the animal from the Fairgrounds.

All rabbits, poultry and beef heifers at the Junior Livestock Auction are pick up live sales and there is no resale available.

***Special Note:*** Please carefully consider the disposition of the animal you purchase. Any change in disposition after signing the sales invoice will be made only one hour past sale completion. No changes will be accepted after that time.
