**Grade Level:** 4-5 (Murdock Elementary School)

**Publisher**: Simon & Schuster, 1987 **Text/Novel:** *Hatchet*; by Gary Paulsen

*Hatchet*, a Newbery Award-winning novel published in 1987 by author Gary Paulsen, is an esteemed story about a young boy's struggle to survive after his airplane crashes in the Canadian wilderness. This work of young adult fiction appeals to readers of all ages for its descriptive prose and exciting plot. At age 13, the principal character Brian Robeson is struggling with his parents' divorce. What lies ahead is a much deeper struggle. Brian is the only survivor of a plane crashes in the Canadian wilderness. With only the clothes on his back and a hatchet his mother had given him, Brian perseveres through a fifty-four day ordeal. <sup>1</sup>
